



Under new legislation set out in **the Environment Act 2021**, the UK government will begin introducing compulsory food waste collections. Starting **31 March 2025**, businesses in England must arrange **separate collections for food waste**.

What does it mean for your business?

If your business has **more than 10 employees** and produces **more than 5 kg of food waste** per week, you will be required to install a separate food waste collection service.

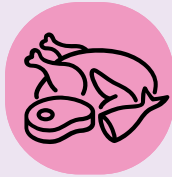

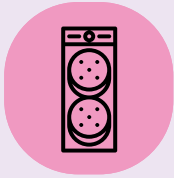

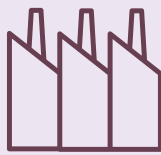

What happens to collected food waste?

We transfer your food waste to the facility where it is treated,

moved to the anaerobic digester,

producing biogas used for electricity and heating



as well as biofertilisers.

Anaerobic digestion - the process that uses microbes to break down organic waste in the absence of oxygen. It significantly reduces carbon dioxide and methane emissions and provides greater economic benefits compared to landfill.
